Candlemas

Feast Days

Monday 3rd - Memorial of St Blaise

St Blaise was of noble birth and, after being educated in the Christian faith, was made bishop of Sebastia. Although Christianity had been adopted about 300 AD as the state religion in Armenia, the Roman emperor Licinius began a persecution of the Christians, and Blaise was discovered and apprehended. While imprisoned, he miraculously cured a boy from fatally choking. After being torn with wool combers' irons, St Blaise was beheaded. Mass on Monday will finish with the traditional blessing of throats.

Tuesday 4th - Memorial of St Jane of Valois

St Jane was the daughter of King Louis XI of France, who was treated poorly by both her father and her husband. Said to be sickly and slightly deformed, her father sent her away to a chateau where she was raised out of sight and mind. Her value to her father was purely political in nature and he betrothed her as a child to the heir apparent, Louis, Duke of Orleans. Her husband was angry about the forced marriage which occurred when Jane was 12, and his treatment of her reflected his displeasure. When her husband ascended to the throne as Louis XII, Jane became empress. It was brief since her husband appealed to the pope for an annulment claiming the marriage was never consummated. The annulment liberated Jane to move forward with her desire to life a religious life. With the assistance of her Franciscan advisor Jane established the Franciscan order of the Annunciation. Members of her community devoted themselves to prayer, penance and cultivating the virtues of the Blessed Mother. St Jane is depicted in the East window of the church, second in from the right.

Wednesday 5th - Memorial of St Agatha

St Agatha is one of the most celebrated early Christian Virgin Martyrs. Living in the 3rd Century, little is known about her except that she came from a family of importance and dedicated her life to God at an early age. She suffered torture for her faith, especially because of her determination to protect her purity, and offered her life in martyrdom at Catania in Sicily, probably during the persecution of Decius. She was venerated throughout the Church from the earliest times, devotion being witnessed in the Martyrology of Jerome and the Calendar of Carthage (c.550Ad). Her name is included the Roman Canon.

Thursday 6th - Memorial of St Paul Miki and his Companions

St Paul was born in Japan about the year 1564. He entered the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) and preached the Gospel with great success, but when a persecution of Catholics arose he and twenty five others, comprising priests, brothers and laymen, Jesuits and Franciscans, doctors and catechists, were arrested and subjected to terrible tortures. Finally they were martyred by crucifixion at Nagasaki on 5th February 1597. From his cross, St Paul preached to the people gathered there and prayed for forgiveness for his executioners.
